CITIZENS FORUM

Henry Berry, 1st District citizen, spoke about the Electric Board Minutes that should be in commissioners packets every month and the responsibilities of the board members.

Carol Wallace, Director of Benton County Senior Center, spoke about the problems with the current building they are in.

Kathy Weatherly, Benton County Fair, spoke in favor of the Farmer's Market project and the benefits to our county and the County Fair.

Iris Clifft, citizen, spoke in favor of the Farmer's Market project and benefits of being able to buy local fruits and vegetables.

Debbie Baldwin also spoke in favor of the Farmer's Market project and that it will be a good thing for our 4-H kids and that the location will be much safer for citizens traveling in and out of the area. She is in favor of food vendors and crafters that the Farmer's Market will attract.

Matt Stowe, DA, spoke about Benton County and Camden being on the top 10 list for being the safest areas to live. He just wanted to say "Thank You" for the community team work to make our area safe.

COMMISSIONERS FORUM

Commissioner Powers said she really appreciates the citizens that spoke in Citizens Forum and voiced their opinions and thoughts surrounding our county issues.

Commissioner Fowler questioned Mayor Lashlee's military activity intent. Mayor Lashlee responded by saying he would speak on the issue in the Mayor's Forum.

<u>COUNTY MAYOR, ATTORNEY, FINANCE ADVISOR, INVITED GUEST SPEAKER</u> <u>FORUM, OR PROCLAMATIONS</u>

Susan Noles, Director of Tourism, spoke about the benefits of a Farmer's Market in Benton County.

Paul Summers, Chairman of the Benton County Audit Committee presented the Audit report for 2020.

Mayor Lashee spoke to the Commission and addressed some earlier comments and questions. He said the Senior Citizens Center building is not in good condition. He said the Farmer's Market brings optimism to the County.

Mayor Lashlee responded to rumors that he has to sneak in the office at night. He said that he gives many hours to County Business and Benton County and his desire is to serve the citizens of this county.

Mayor Lashlee also says he is a member of the Tennessee National Guard and could get deployed or mobilized at any time but that the Commissioners will be the first to know and together work it out. He says if he is called, he will answer the call to duty.

Mayor Lashlee commented on the condition of several county buildings including EMA and AG Extension offices. The buildings are not in good shape and he says a capital improvement plan is needed to move ahead. We need quality of life improvements.

PROCLAMATION

Whereas, Sexual Assault Awareness Month is intended to draw attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and has public health implications for every community member of the and County of Benton; and

Whereas, Benton County, TN share a critical concern for victims of sexual violence and a desire to support their needs for justice and healing; and

Whereas, Rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment impact our communities as seen by statistics indicating that one in five women and one in ten men experience sexual assault in their lifetime; and

Whereas, in 2020, more than 500 reports of rape and/or sexual assault were made to law enforcement in West Tennessee (excluding Shelby County); 256 West Tennessee victims of sexual assault were served by WRAP, and Jackson-Madison County General Hospital SANE performed 133 forensic exams; and

Whereas, current estimates suggest no more than 20 percent of sexual assaults will be reported to law enforcement, and less than 3 percent will result in the conviction and incarceration of the perpetrator; and

Whereas, research documents that survivors are far more likely to disclose their sexual assault to a friend or family member, and when these loved ones respond with doubt, shame, or blame, victims suffer additional negative effects on their physical and psychological well-being; and

Whereas, our communities recognize the remarkable strength, courage, and resilience survivors possess and that, with the appropriate support, resources, and information, survivors of sexual violence can follow their own path towards healing and restoration; and

Whereas, the "Start by Believing" public awareness campaign (a program of End Violence Against Women International) is designed to improve the responses of friends, family members, and community professionals so that they can help victims to access supportive resources and engage the criminal justice system; and

Whereas, County of Benton acknowledge that survivors of sexual violence belong to diverse backgrounds, identities, cultures, and communities, and join WRAP in celebrating these unique characteristics of survivors which help aid them in their healing and discovery of their own resilience; and

Whereas, the County of Benton strongly support the efforts of national, state, and local partners, and of every citizen to actively engage in public and private efforts, including conversations about what sexual violence is, how to prevent it, how to help survivors connect with services, and how every segment of our society can work together to better address sexual violence based in an attitude of belief,

Now Therefore, I, Mayor Brett Lashlee on behalf of the County of Benton, Tennessee, hereby proclaim, our shared support of the "Start By Believing" public awareness campaign, and do declare the month of April 2021 as

Sexual Assault Awareness Month

and urge all citizens to join WRAP and all support service programs in the belief that all community members must be part of the solution to end sexual violence.






